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# ARTS EDUCATION CONNECTION SAN DIEGO AWAREDED CALIFORNIA ARTS COUNCIL JUMP STARTS GRANT

State funds support programming in San Diego County Juvenile Court and Community Schools.

SAN DIEGO, CA - Arts Education Connection San Diego (AECSD) announces it has been awarded \$45,000 from the California Arts Council to support its Art Works and Theater Works Fellowship program in local Juvenile Court and Community Schools. These two programs provide at-promise youth with theater and visual arts training along with professional skill building to create a pathway to understanding the arts as a creative, fulfilling, and viable career.

The Art Works Fellowship uses the visual arts to prepare students for college and careers. Fellows enrolled in this program learn visual art skills in photography, drawing and printmaking. They meet artists from a variety of industries and are mentored by teaching and practicing artists to develop their capstone project. Once a week, students gather virtually to interview art professionals and learn professional development skills. Students from all three sites participate in three field trips to local cultural partners. Guest speakers provide real life work examples that support students' learning and production of capstone projects.

The Theatre Works Fellowship is a partnership between AECSD, JCCS' Monarch School, and the San Diego Repertory Theatre. Theatre Works is rooted in performance, connecting concepts and practical application to the business and industry of the Theatre. The lead teaching artist provides mentorship, guiding Fellows' exploration of the theatre arts to meet their specific interests, college major, and career focus. Fellows observe professionals at The Rep, including actors, costumers, directors, front of house manager, lighting specialists, prop and stage managers. Fellows attend rehearsals, performances, tech check, and job-shadowing at The Rep. Student cohorts meet twice a week, and individually with the teaching artist to receive feedback and support as they develop their exhibition, performances, and capstone projects.

"We are thrilled to receive this funding that allows us to continue our long-standing partnerships with the JCCS," says executive director Adrienne Valencia. "It allows us to grow our relationships with these students, helping them to become the next generation of artists and teachers."

Arts Education Connection San Diego was featured as part of a <u>larger announcement</u> from the California Arts Council, with grant awards for its Cycle A programming totaling more than \$31 million across more than 1,100 grants supporting nonprofit organizations and units of government



throughout the state. The dollar amount already marks the largest annual investment in the California Arts Council's 46-year history.

"We are elated today to be able to say that, with this first round of funds, we are placing a historic amount of money into the very worthy hands of California's arts and cultural workforce—and with more yet to come," said California Arts Council Chair Lilia Gonzáles-Chávez. "We have long since understood the value of our artists in this state, and we are incredibly grateful to our Governor and our Legislature for their support and sharing in a like-minded vision for a California where all people flourish with access to and participation in the arts."

Organizations were awarded grants across seven different program areas within Cycle A, focused on the CAC's efforts to address geographic equity, enable autonomy and sustainability for smaller organizations, and grow the strength of local arts agencies and their partnerships.
