Our Programs & Prop. 28

There may need to be some clarification regarding Proposition 28 and how the funds can be spent in our schools. Let's clear up some of the misconceptions and how AECSD will continue to partner with our school districts in San Diego County.

What is Prop. 28?

 Prop. 28 is a California state referendum that increased funding for the state's arts and music education programs in PK-12 schools. California voters approved it in November 2022 with 64% of the vote. The funding provides a minimum annual financing source in PK-12 public schools, public charter schools, and every preschool and transitional kindergarten.

How can schools spend Prop. 28 funds?

 At least 80% of the funds should be used for credentialed or classified employees. 19% can be used for professional learning, field trips, materials/supplies/equipment, or supplemental programming by organizations such as AECSD, and 1% can be used for district administration.

How can we work with your school or district? We can provide:

- Specialized arts instruction, such as hip-hop dance or recycled art
- Arts Integration programming, pairing an art form with another academic content area
- Professional Learning for your classroom teachers, helping them use the arts to infuse their daily lesson plans with creativity
